## Summary

<u>Clause</u> - A group of words that contain a subject and a verb. The cat slept.

## <u>Punctuation</u>

The marks used in writing that help readers understand what they are reading.

Noun - are used to name people, animals, places or things.

<u>Proper nouns-</u> start with a capital letter e.g. names of people, places, days of the week.

Adjective: a describing word e.g. shiny, dangerous, new, noisy.

<u>Verb</u>: a word that expresses an action or a state of being e.g. think, kick, go.

Noun phrase: is made up of a noun and any words that are modifying that noun (usually the, my, this, most, adjectives) e.g. the hungry goat.

Noun phrases perform exactly the same role as common nouns in a sentence.

<u>Subordination</u>: used to connect words, phrases and clauses of unequal importance.

This adds extra information to the sentence.

She cut both the hedge and the tree because they were too tall.

<u>Co-ordination</u>: a word that connects words, phrases and clauses of equal importance.

<u>Apostrophes</u>: show possession or omission.

e.g. The boy's bike. it's -it is you're- you are

<u>Prefixes</u>: added to the start of a word. anti, out, im, in

<u>Suffixes:</u> added to the end of a word. Ing, ed, er, ness
